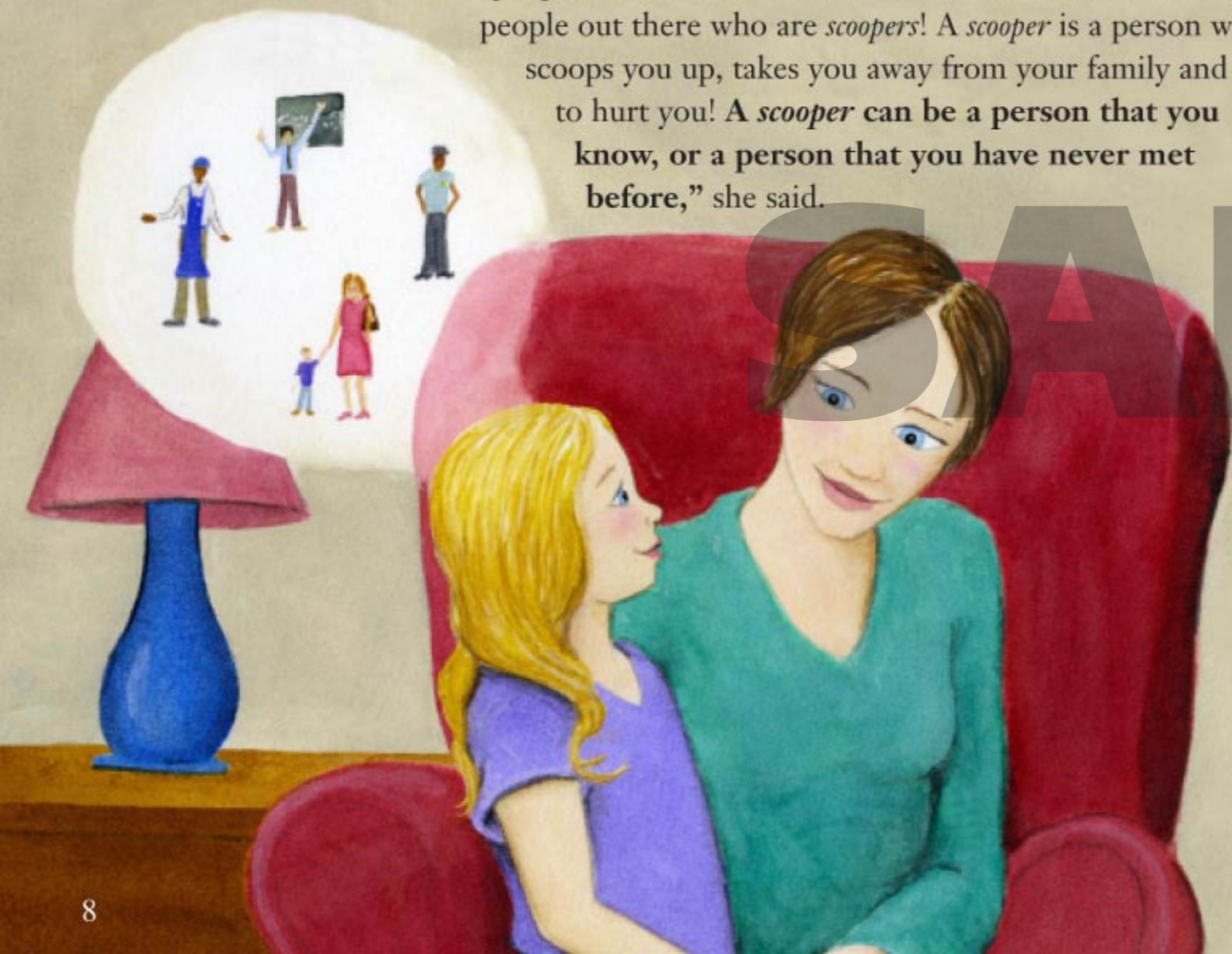
I was outside playing with Zippy,
